


INTRODUCTION

The Citizen's Budget is prepared each year to give the people of Hirshabelle a clear picture of how government money is raised and spent. It explains the size of the budget, the main sources of revenue, and the key priorities for spending in 2026.

For this year, the estimated budget amounts to \$41.45 million, of which about \$9.03 million will come from domestic revenue and the rest from international partners. Most of this money will go to essential services such as security, education, health, agriculture, and social protection.



It is part of our commitment to strengthen trust, accountability, and inclusive development in Hirshabelle.






CITIZEN BUDGET 2026

THE BUDGET PROCESS



The Ministry of Finance prepares the annual budget, setting out expected revenues and planned spending for each sector. The draft is then debated and approved by Parliament before becoming law. Once approved, Ministries and agencies receive funds to deliver services such as schools and hospitals. Throughout the year, the Ministry of Finance monitors spending, while Parliament and the Auditor General provide oversight. This process – from drafting to approval, implementation, and audit – ensures public funds are used responsibly and transparently.





CITIZEN BUDGET 2026

Achievements

Budget performance in 2024 showed a major improvement compared to previous years, with 92% of planned revenues realized. This marks a sharp rise from 2022–2023, when collections lagged far behind estimates. The results highlight stronger fiscal management and revenue mobilization, though sustaining this momentum will be key for 2026.



Economic Outlook


Somalia's economy grew by 4.1% in 2024, continuing steady recovery, with GDP reaching \$12 billion and per capita income rising to \$737. Growth has been driven by strong remittances and grants, which boosted household consumption and investment. However, most of this demand was met through imports, widening the trade deficit despite good export performance from livestock and crops. For 2026, Hirshabelle is expected to grow around 3.5%, with inflation easing to 4.5–6%. Remittances and donor support remain vital lifelines, while opportunities exist in agriculture, irrigation, and renewable energy to strengthen resilience and reduce dependence on imports.

Hirshabelle State budget for 2026 amounts to \$41.45 million, with most resources concentrated on governance, security, education, and food security. The top five ministries — Interior & Local Government (\$7.8M), Security & Rehabilitation (\$6.08M), Education (\$4.7M), Agriculture (\$3.9M), and Livestock (\$3.5M) — together take over 60% of the budget, reflecting urgent priorities for stability, service delivery, and livelihoods. Health and water services also receive notable allocations, while smaller ministries like Justice, Youth, and Women's Affairs are funded to keep essential services running. This focus shows continuity from 2025, with government doubling down on peace, local governance, and basic services as the foundations for long-term development.

- 1: Focus on security, infrastructure, education, health, and social protection.
- 2: Building roads and water access, expanding schools, improving healthcare.


